
Bus Cancellations

Appropriate Dress for Cold Weather

The days are getting colder and winter will soon arrive. We ask that students dress appropriately; i.e. coats, gloves, mitts, boots etc. If they are dressed warmly, they are better prepared to participate in outdoor activities. Ensuring that your children's items are labelled would be extremely helpful if items are lost or misplaced. As the days get colder, there will be instances when the students will not go out for outdoors. Dufferin -Peel's policy is that the amount of



time outdoors should be reduced for children (grade 8 and under) when the temperature is -20

degrees Celsius or colder. When the temperature or equivalent wind chill temperature is minus 25 degrees Celsius or lower children shall be kept indoors.



Clinic expectations are modified to meet the different abilities of students from JK to grade 8. If desired, the music department head can contact Ray Kingsmore for suggested Pre-Visit and Post-

hearing deficiencies can be accommodated.

Concepts vary according to grade levels. Primary students will be exposed to 3 basic Drum Rudiments. Older students will have a much more in-depth experience. All grade level participants will enjoy creating "Free Style" applications of Rudiments while playing their drums to music.

Kindergarten Registration for the 2025-2026 school year is now open



Kindergarten registration for the 2025-2026 school year at Dufferin-Peel Catholic District School Board (DPCDSB) schools is now open. DPCDSB offers the Kindergarten program in 125 Catholic elementary schools in Mississauga, Brampton, Caledon, Bolton and Orangeville.

Parents/guardians can register online at <u>dpcdsb.org</u>.

Registration is open to Catholic children and children of Catholic parents. Kindergarten students must be at least four (4) years of age by December 31, 2025.

The following documents are required to complete the registration process:

- · Proof of age of the child
- Original Roman Catholic baptismal certificate (for child and/or parent/guardian) or original baptismal certificate from a church in full communion with the Holy See of Rome or an Eastern Catholic Church.
- Immunization Reference #'s from the local Public Health Unit
- Proof of Canadian citizenship or permanent resident status
- Proof of home address
- Proof of English Separate School Support

Please refer to the Register for School webpage for accepted forms of documentation.
